The first concept students worked on at Early Band was playing simple melodies as a group, allowing students to learn correct balance, new pitches and rhythms. The author and composer penned this sleigh ride tune around 1850, including suggestions of high-speed youthful fun and taking along a favorite gal! In 1965 the Gemini 6 astronauts who were orbiting the Earth played "Jingle Bells" on instruments they smuggled onboard, making it the first song played from outer space.

The audience's responsibility at formal concerts is to honor the efforts of the performers by providing a listening atmosphere in which their performance can be appreciated by all. Since we do not have an auditorium for concerts, we must transform the gymnasium into a concert hall. To that end, we ask your cooperation:



- Turn cell phones to silent.
- Remain seated and quiet when the performance is in progress. (If it becomes necessary to leave the gym, please do so between musical selections.)
- If young children become restless and disrupt others' ability to listen, please take them from the gymnasium until they are quiet.
- Reserve comments for between selections.
- Show your appreciation for the performance by clapping after each piece. (Whistling and cheering are not appropriate at a formal concert.)
- Please refrain from waving to your child during the concert.

  (After all, they know who you are & know you are here; you most likely brought them!)
